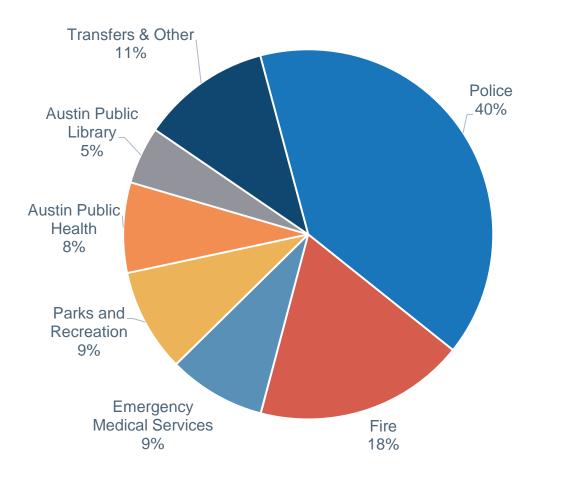


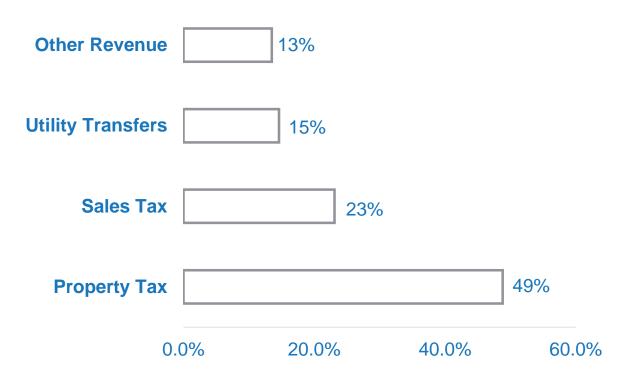
Other funds include Airport, Convention Center, Transportation, Public Works, Austin Resource Recovery, Development Services, and other special revenue funds.

FY 2019-20 POLICE BUDGET \$434.5 MILLION

Neighborhood-Based Policing provides immediate police service, criminal investigations, and collaborative problem solving initiatives to the community.

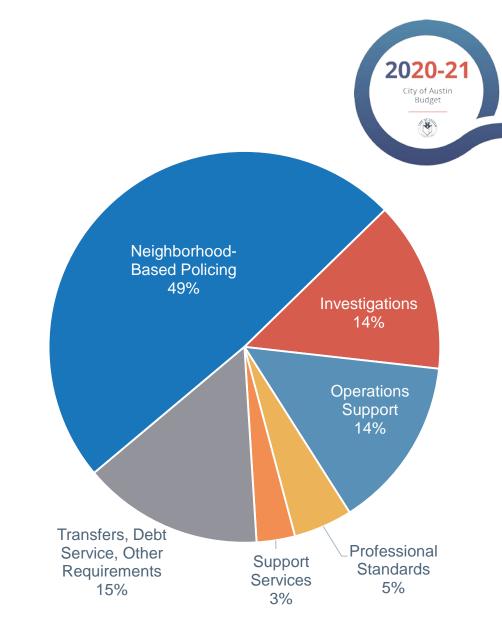
Operations Support provides intake and processing of police calls for service, forensic analysis, victim services, and fleet, equipment, and facility maintenance services to APD employees and the public.

Investigations provides an impartial and complete investigation of cases that require a particularly high level of expertise to Area Commands, victims, suspects, external members of criminal justice agencies, and the public.

Professional Standards provides ethical, professional direction, and training to APD employees.

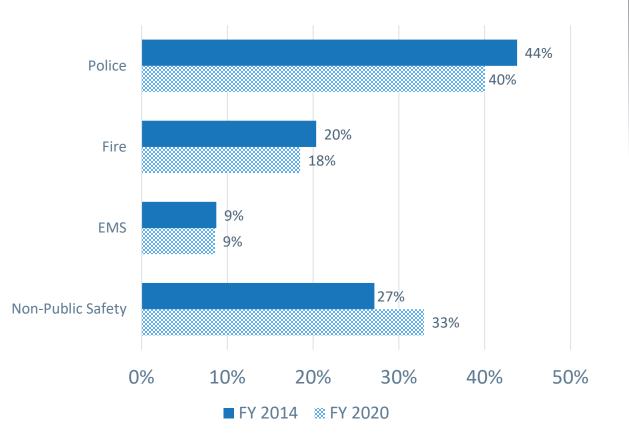
Support Services provides administrative and managerial support.

Transfers, Debt Service, and Other Requirements primarily comprises interdepartmental transfers and other departmental requirements at the fund or agency level.

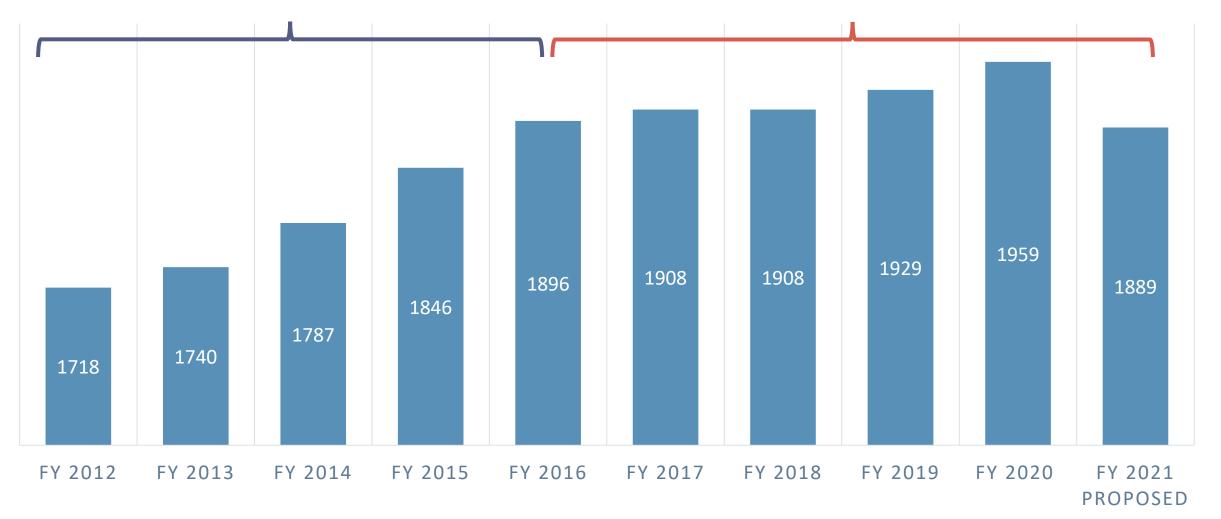

Policing Policies



- Ban on use of tear gas and chokeholds
- Limitations on the use of impact munitions and the use of deadly force
- Council approval for purchases of military grade weaponry
- Restrictions on the use of no-knock warrants
- Ban on the use of facial recognition for criminal investigation, law enforcement, or surveillance purposes
- Delay July cadet class until community members agree that their work has been appropriately incorporated in the training curriculum

Reduce Funding:



- No additional sworn staff positions in FY 2021
- Eliminate sworn positions that cannot reasonably be filled in FY 2021
- No *additional* funding for militarized equipment including tear gas, rubber bullets, and bean bag rounds

Increase Funding For:



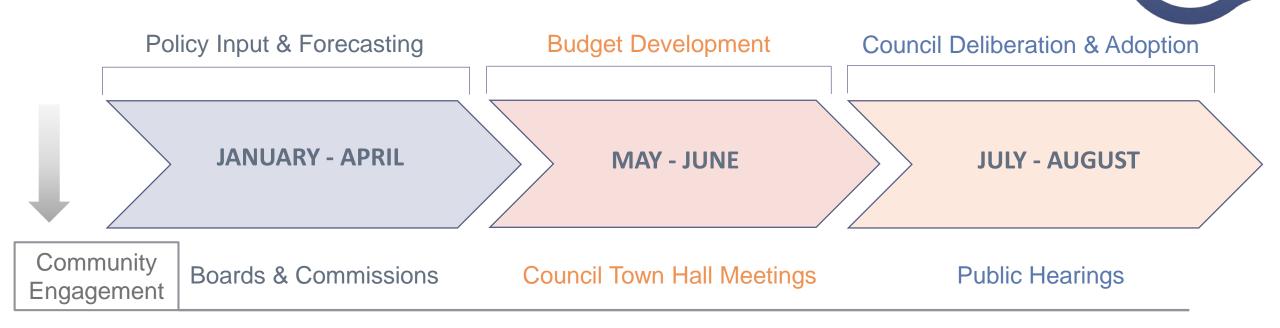
- Alternative public safety and public health strategies
- Programs to reduce or eliminate arrests for low-level, non-violent offenses
- Mental health first response including the Meadows Institute Report
- Distribution of and training in the use of Naloxone for drug overdoses
- Office of Police Oversight and Equity Office
- Rewrite of APD General Orders
- Implementation of forthcoming audit recommendations and reports
- New audits of APD disciplinary records and costs incurred related to suspected or confirmand officer misconduct

Other Budget Direction



- Explore options for reallocating staff and roles currently performed by APD to:
 - Other departments
 - New City units such as an Office of Violence Prevention
 - Outside entities including non-profits
- No cuts to victim services and the sex crimes unit
- Propose ways to structure the FY 2021 APD budget using outcomes-based budgeting and zero-based budgeting frameworks
- Review all grants for alignment to Council's vision for APD policies and practices

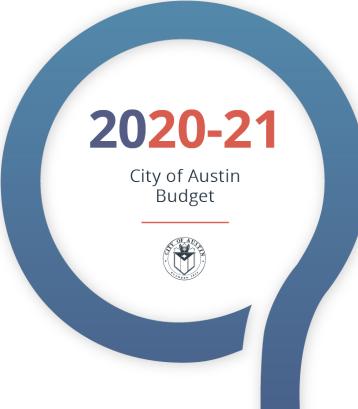
